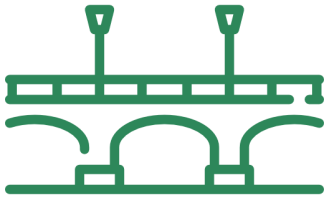


# 2022 Community Health Assessment

## Resident Survey Key Findings

The Clinton County Health Department asked county residents for their opinions on health, social and environmental issues in the community. They were also asked to identify any barriers to medical care experienced by themselves or their family in the past year. Surveys were collected from 1,081 residents. **Aging infrastructure** was the top environmental concern with more than **3 in 5** residents surveyed selecting it.

Almost **40%** of respondents indicated **stream, river, or lake quality** was an environmental concern.



**91%** of respondents experienced **1 or more health challenge** for themselves or family in the past year.



reported being **overweight or obese**.

**75%**



of respondents experienced **1 or more social challenge** for themselves or family in the past year.

#### Top ranked challenges:

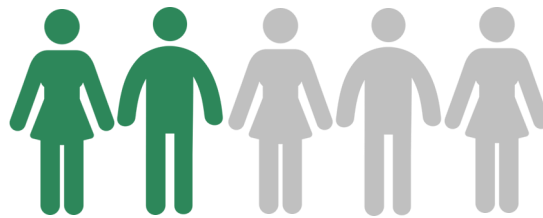
- Lack of a livable wage
- Opportunities for physical activity
- Affordable housing
- Street safety

**1 in 3** live with **chronic disease**.



**35%** reported **issues related to aging**.

**2 in 3** faced at least **1 barrier to receiving medical care in the past year**.



**42%** of individuals surveyed **agree or strongly agree** that they **live in a healthy community**.

More than **1 in 3** indicated **mental health** was a challenge.



**115** respondents reported having **poor or extremely poor physical health**.

Note: Statistics on issues for individuals and their family are based on those respondents who indicated that they had any issues. 9% of respondents reported no health issues; 25% reported no social issues. Survey responses represented residents from 100% of Clinton County townships, ages 17—80+, and all census income and education categories.
